SENATE RESOLUTION No. 1850

A RESOLUTION in memory of M. Jarvin Emerson.

WHEREAS, M. Jarvin Emerson, Ph.D., was born April 22, 1935, and died March 16, 1996; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Emerson had been a resident of Manhattan and associated with Kansas State University since 1962. At the time of his death, he was a professor of economics and the director of graduate studies for the Department of Economics of Kansas State University. He served previously as head of the Department of Economics; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Emerson had been a visiting professor at several universities, including universities in Australia and China, and was the author or co-author of more than 80 publications. He was recognized as a world authority on economic regional input-output models, and his model was used in forecasting revenue streams for the state of Kansas; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Emerson was a long-time member of the state Consensus Revenue Estimating Group, served as Chief Economist for the Kansas Office of Economic Analysis and was a member of the Governor's Commission on a Public Agenda for Kansas; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Emerson was married to Anne Natvig on December 27, 1958. She survives in addition to two sons, Kent and Mark, and two daughters, Kari and Lori: Now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas: That we express our deepest sympathy to the family and friends of Dr. Emerson; and
