Rural Development Education

- Need for graduates who understand the issues facing rural communities and businesses
 - Sustainable development
 - Marketing of local businesses on a global scale
 - Fostering a productive environment for entrepreneurship

Rural Communities and Agriculture

- Sometimes "farm" and "rural" are used interchangeably
- Are they one and the same?
- How closely linked are agriculture and rural communities?

Farm versus Rural

- In 1950
 - 40% of rural population lived on farms
 - 33% of rural workers worked in agriculture
- USDA 2007
 - Less than 10% of rural pop. lives on farms
 - 6.5% of rural workers work in agriculture

Farm and Rural

- 20% of all rural counties are farm dependent
 - Greater than 20% of personal income from farming
- 78% of these had population decline between 2000 and 2005
- 89% of "farm" income comes from off-farm

Farm vs Rural

- Farm dependent counties
 - More remote from metro areas
 - Less population density
 - Lack amenities

The Rural Labor Force

- Population decline in almost all rural areas
 - Particularly high density rural
- Incomes lower, poverty rates higher
- Lower educational attainment
- Higher percentage on disability
- Agricultural productivity has increased
 - Produce more with fewer workers

Rural Federal Spending

- \$390 billion in 2007
 - Mostly for Social Security and Health care
 - Defense and other government
- \$62 billion for infrastructure, agriculture and education
 - \$9 billon for agriculture

President's New Policies

- Recognizes diversified rural economies
- Support for small business
 - USDA coordinate with other agencies
 - Encourage entrepreneurship, clustering
 - Clean energy
 - Rural tourism

President's New Policies

- Strengthening infrastructure
 - Roads, bridges, water projects, broadband internet
- Education and health care
 - Close the gaps between rural and urban attainment
 - Close the gaps between rural and urban level of care

Justification

- Rural development an increasingly important aspect of training in agriculture
 - Transition away from agriculture-dependent to nonagriculture-dependent economies.
- E-commerce techniques and international trade competency provide a way for rural communities to join/understand increasingly globalized market
- GIS increasingly used for planning/zoning
- Grantwriting important for community improvement

 - Online payment fraud, security issues
 - Ethics and legal issues
 - Technology

- International Trade and Policy
- Objectives:
 - Apply theory and analysis to understanding economic opportunities in the world
 - Patterns of trade, tariffs, quotas
 - Practical implementation of imports/exports

Goals/Outcomes/Impacts

- Program will provide students with uniquely targeted competencies
- Prepare them to become the leaders and drivers of economic development in rural areas.
